We welcome you to the Streets of Downtown Detroit for the 2025 Chevrolet Detroit Grand Prix presented by Lear. As we celebrate the 35th Grand Prix in Detroit's history, we are so excited to add to the legacy of this event – back in the heart of the Motor City for the third consecutive year.

THE GRAND PRIX IS COMMUNITY DRIVEN

With the Chevrolet Detroit Grand Prix presented by Lear's return to its original home on the Streets of Detroit, the event has become even more connected and engaged with the neighborhoods and communities across the city than ever before. As a 501(c)3 non-profit organization and a subsidiary of the Downtown Detroit Partnership, the Grand Prix has a tradition of community engagement. With the generous support of its key Community Partners at American Axle Manufacturing, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan, Delta Dental, Delta Airlines, DTE Foundation, Henry Ford Health, Huntington Bank and PNC Bank, the event has opened its arms even wider to the community since its return to Downtown Detroit in 2023.

The Grand Prix is truly one of the most inclusive and welcoming annual events across the State of Michigan. Once again in 2025, more than half of the Grand Prix venue is open and available to fans for free all weekend long. From the free viewing platforms along Jefferson Avenue to the Meijer Fan Zone down Woodward Avenue, the activation in Hart Plaza and the beautiful Detroit Riverwalk, fans can be a part of the event and access areas all around the Grand Prix track completely free of charge. Campus Martius Park and Cadillac Square will also be open and accessible to fans, once again featuring the unique Small Business Straightaway – highlighting locally-owned businesses from across the different districts in Detroit – on Woodward Avenue. The Grand Prix is able to offer these unique complimentary viewing options and engagement opportunities thanks to the support of its dedicated Community Partners.

The Grand Prix is also proud of the opportunities it creates for local students, artists and businesses to shine during one of Detroit's most popular summertime festivals. For the 13th consecutive year, the Grand Prix has worked with the talented students at the College for Creative Studies (CCS) in Detroit to create the official

commemorative event poster. We hope you enjoy this year's poster design created by CCS sophomore Eli Archer, a unique design that features a young Detroit resident roller skating on the Grand Prix street circuit while the racing activities bring the city to life around her. We are also excited to showcase digital mural designs created by the young students at the Boys & Girls Clubs of Southeastern Michigan (BGCSM), proudly displayed on the track barrier walls in front of the viewing platforms on Jefferson Avenue. In 2025, the Grand Prix has expanded its partnership with BGCSM to create a Correspondent Industry Club offering a select group of students the opportunity to learn about media arts, public relations, marketing and more while getting real world experience in all of these areas through the Grand Prix.

The Grand Prix will continue to expand its charitable outreach in 2025. Friday night's PwC Grand Prixmiere presented by Chevrolet gala will help raise several hundred thousand dollars to benefit several important local non-profit organizations including the Belle Isle Conservancy, the Boys and Girls Clubs of Southeastern Michigan, Detroit 300 Conservancy, the Detroit Public Safety Foundation and the Pope Francis Center in Detroit.

The Grand Prix continues to establish itself as one of the most sustainable events in Michigan. With impactful environmentally friendly initiatives – including comprehensive recycling and waste diversion programs to go along with unique community engagement and enhancement opportunities – the Chevrolet Detroit Grand Prix presented by Lear became the first event in Michigan and the first motorsports event worldwide to achieve Gold level certification from the Council for Responsible Sport in 2023 and the event reached Gold status again in 2024. The event will look to raise the bar even higher this year as the Grand Prix continues to deepen its community connection.



TRAVEL TO THE VENUE & EVENT PARKING

When traveling to the venue use the following resources to help plan your route. Be sure to check for daily updates.

MDOT – Michigan Department of Transportation, Michigan State Highway System

DDOT – Detroit Department of Transportation; primary public transportation operator serving Detroit

Routes leading to the venue

- M-10 – John C Lodge Freeway is only open to Larned Street. West Jefferson will be closed.
- I-375 is open to Lafayette unless traveling to Canada (proper documents required) or if you have a parking pass for a garage inside of the venue.

NOTE – Travelers are encouraged to exit before the Larned Street and Lafayette Blvd exits for surface lot parking and to avoid traffic back-ups.

NOTE – Vehicles leaving the Detroit Windsor Tunnel will be routed Eastbound on Jefferson Ave directly onto I-375 unless a Detroit Grand Prix parking pass is displayed in the front window.

EVENT PARKING

An official Detroit Grand Prix parking pass is required for access to any of the parking garages located inside of the venue. Franklin Garage parking passes are sold in advance of the event to the public.

NOTE: Event parking pass must be displayed in front window when approaching the venue; vehicles must enter via I-375.

Ample public parking is available in garages and surface lots throughout Downtown Detroit, north of Jefferson Avenue. Consider using The Detroit People Mover or the Q-Line for convenient transport to stops near the Grand Prix venue.

THE DETROIT PEOPLE MOVER

The People Mover is a free form of transportation. There are several convenient transits stops to access the venue.

Cadillac Center Station – Campus Martius, Cadillac Square

Financial District Station – Grandstand 3A, 3B, Turn 3 Club, Woodard Avenue, Hart Plaza

Renaissance Center Station – Grandstand 1, 8, 9, Paddock

Operates 5 am – midnight Friday & Saturday; 5 am – 10 pm Sunday

QLINE

The QLine is a free transportation option along Woodward Avenue that connects Downtown Detroit with Midtown, New Center and North End. The QLine allows guests to park outside of Downtown Detroit during race weekend, and provides a free ride close to the venue. Those using the Q-Line will get off the transit at State Street.

PARK DETROIT APP

Download the Park Detroit App for information on parking locations around Downtown Detroit. The app allows you to pre-purchase and reserve your parking. We suggest utilizing the Park Detroit App to determine parking location, along with the Detroit People Mover or QLine to get close to the venue.

RIDE SHARE & BUS DROP OFF LOCATIONS

There are three locations outside the venue that are designated as Ride Share drop off locations (Lyft, Uber, etc.) as well as bus and limo drop-off.

West Location along Fort Street, between Washington and Shelby, between the 200 and 300 blocks of West Fort Street.

East Location Riopelle between Jefferson and Woodbridge.

BUS SERVICE FROM DETROIT METRO AIRPORT

The Regional Transit Authority has launched a direct bus service from Detroit Metropolitan Airport to Downtown Detroit. Go to Detroit Air Xpress for information and tickets.

BIKE RENTAL

MoGo is a nonprofit bike share system with 620 bikes at 75 stations across six Metro Detroit cities. Designed for quick trips around town, MoGo is a fun, flexible, and convenient way to get to the venue.

NOTE – Bicycles are not permitted within the race circuit.

GATE REGULATIONS

INCREASED SECURITY MEASURES

Guests are screened prior to entering the venue by security personnel using a hand-held wand device or a walk-through metal detector. All bags are subject to search. Any items on prohibited list, are illegal or considered suspicious are subject to confiscation and guests could be denied entry.

DETROIT GRAND PRIX PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Weapons of any kind, including but not limited to, pocketknives, firearms and ammunition
- Unmanned aerial devices such as drones, remote piloted aircraft & similar remote-controlled devices
- Rollerblades, hoverboards, skateboards, bicycles
- Glass bottles or open containers
- Alcoholic beverages
- Illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia
- Video recording devices, camera stands, tripods
- Large buggy strollers & hard sided wagons
- Ladders, scaffolding, platforms or other structures
- Bleacher back stadium seats
- Lawn chairs, camping chairs (permitted in Franklin Garage Tailgating only).
- Samples, stickers, or flyers for distribution
- Flags, banners, flagpoles
- Golf carts, scooters (except mobility aid devices)
- Animals (other than assistance dogs)

Detroit Grand Prix reserves the right to remove an assistance dog that impedes the enjoyment of guests or is considered a threat to others. Assistance dogs must remain on leash or tether.

Any item that may pose a safety hazard to or diminish the enjoyment of event by others may be refused at the discretion of security and management. Prohibited items are subject to change without notice. There are no provisions for checking and holding prohibited items. Items cannot be left at or around the gates. Items left unattended will be removed and discarded.

ALLOWABLE ITEMS

- Cameras, binoculars, scanners
- Coolers and bags measuring 12"x 12"x 12" or less
- Seat cushions 18" or less
- Umbrellas, umbrella strollers, collapsible canvas wagons

NOTE – Umbrellas and umbrella strollers cannot be used in grandstands, on viewing platform, or in structures.

RESTRICTED ACCESS TO PARKING STRUCTURES

For the safety of our guests, and to reduce pedestrian traffic within garages, an admission ticket, or credential is required to enter any garage within the venue. Free public viewing is not permitted from floors within parking structures.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION TO KNOW

- Racing activities are held rain or shine.
- No rain checks or exchanges given.
- All sales are final. No refunds.
- Ticket upgrades are at the discretion of the Box Office.
- Participation in racing events as a spectator is at ticketholders own risk. Visit [DetroitGP.com/Terms](https://detroitgp.com/terms) to view Terms of Sale.
- Tickets and other admission materials may not be used for advertising, promotions (including contests and sweepstakes) or other trade purposes, without the prior express written consent of Detroit Grand Prix.
- Tickets may not be resold on the premises.
- Detroit Grand Prix is not responsible for unauthorized duplication of Print-at-Home tickets. Venue reserves the right to refuse entry into the event.
- Detroit Grand Prix reserves the right to remove any guest from the event, without refund, if their behavior is offensive or poses a hazard to others.



TICKET SALES & ADMISSION POLICIES

Our goal is to make your visit enjoyable and a hassle-free experience. Please take the time to review the contents of the Event Guide prior to your visit to familiarize yourself with our venue, policies and all that is available for you to experience.

The Event Guide is updated periodically when additional content or updates are available. Please check DetroitGP.com/EventGuide prior to the event for the most updated version.

RECEIPT OF TICKETS

Contents of ticket package should be checked upon receipt; verify ticket and pass quantities, event dates and seat locations. Report any discrepancies immediately to the Box Office.

Digital tickets come from the email address tickets@DetroitGP.com and can be managed by logging into your online account. A digital ticket guide can be found on our website to assist with downloading and transferring tickets.

Tickets obtained from sources other than the Detroit Grand Prix may be lost, stolen or counterfeit and in such cases will not be honored. The Detroit Grand Prix is not affiliated with any ticket resale companies or websites; any issues that arise from tickets purchased using a third party must be resolved directly with the third party.

TICKET SALES LOCATIONS

Box offices open at 7:30 am daily. Closing time varies.

West Box Office - Jefferson Ave, near Hart Plaza and Grandstand 3B

GM Renaissance Center – Tower 300, Level 1

East Box Office – Woodbridge Ave, behind Grandstand 1

WILL CALL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Ticket orders placed in advance are mailed to addresses within the United States up until two weeks prior to the event; three weeks prior for foreign addresses. Ticket orders placed after the mail cut-off date can be picked up from the Box Office located in the GM Renaissance Center through Thursday, May 29th. Once the race weekend Box Offices open, tickets can be picked up from any of the 3 locations.

Tickets are held under the last name of the party that will be picking up the prepaid tickets. Tickets cannot be released to a party other than the name set up in advance. Photo ID is required. There are no cancellations of pre-purchased tickets and no refunds of unclaimed Will Call.

CAR CORRAL, FRANKLIN GARAGE PARKING & TAILGATING VEHICLE PASS PICK UP

Vehicle parking passes must be displayed prior to approaching the venue. If you purchased either a Car Corral package or a vehicle pass for the Franklin Garage after the mail cutoff date, the prepaid parking pass can be picked up from the Box Office located in the GM Renaissance Center through Thursday, May 29th. Beginning Friday, May 30th, orders containing parking passes are taken off-site to the Grand Prix Credential Center located on the second floor of Steve's Soul Food Restaurant (1440 Franklin Street, Detroit, MI 48207).

ADMISSION GATE RE-ENTRY PROCEDURE

Tickets are scanned at the initial entry through a grandstand or rooftop admission gate; a wristband will be applied. Upon re-entry to a ticketed area, both the wristband and ticket are required for admittance.

RESERVED SEAT GRANDSTANDS

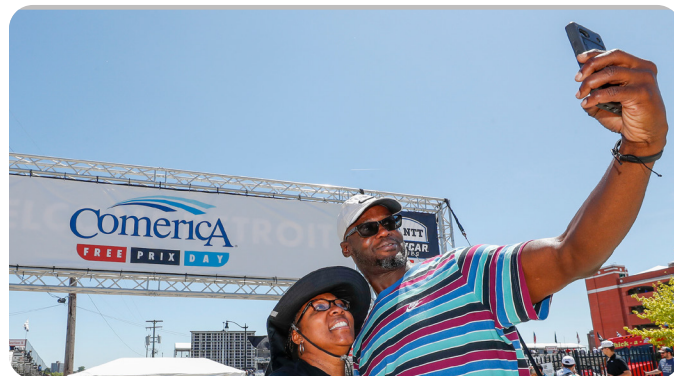
Rows number from the top of the grandstand down; Row 1 is the top row. Sections letter from left to right; section A would be on the left if you are standing in front of the grandstand looking at it. The seats number from left to right. A ticket is required to occupy a reserved seat. Children 2 years of age and under are admitted free of charge when seated on an adult's lap.

WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBLE

Grandstands 1, 3A, 8 and 9 are wheelchair accessible. Row ADA is on a flat platform located in front of the bottom row of grandstand seating; folded padded chairs are provided.

VIEWING PLATFORMS

There are six viewing platforms along E Jefferson Avenue that are open to the public free of charge and available on a first-come basis. An additional viewing platform is located south of the GM Renaissance Center and accessible via the Riverwalk. A dedicated ADA only viewing platform is located between Grandstands 3D & 4. All viewing platforms are ADA accessible.



COMERICA BANK FREE PRIX DAY – FRIDAY, MAY 30

Building on the tradition of "FREE Prix Day" Grandstands 1 & 9 will be open to the public free of charge. Seating is general admission available on a first-come basis, a ticket is not required. Paddock access is NOT included with Free Prix Day seating.

Seats in all other grandstands are available for purchase and sold as a reserved seat ticket with paddock access.

ROOFTOP VIEWING

Four rooftop viewing locations are included in this admission ticket option. Track viewing can be seen from the outer edge of the rooftop and is standing-room only. Large LED screens featuring the racing action are on each rooftop.

Grandstand tickets do not provide admittance to rooftops.

Rooftop Locations

Center Garage – The Rooftop presented by Piston Group - located between Bates Street and Renaissance Drive offers views of Turns 4-7 and the on-track action along the Detroit River.

Port Atwater Garage – located between Beaubien Blvd and St Antoine Street, offers views of Turns 8 and 9, along with the entrance to the unique two-sided pit lane.

Franklin Garage – located between Franklin and Woodbridge streets, overlooks Turn 9 and is directly across from pit lane to provide a unique perspective of the teams servicing the cars during the racing action.

River East Garage – located between Atwater and Franklin Streets, provides unique view of two-sided pit lane, the finish line, pit exit where cars merge back onto the track at Turn 1.



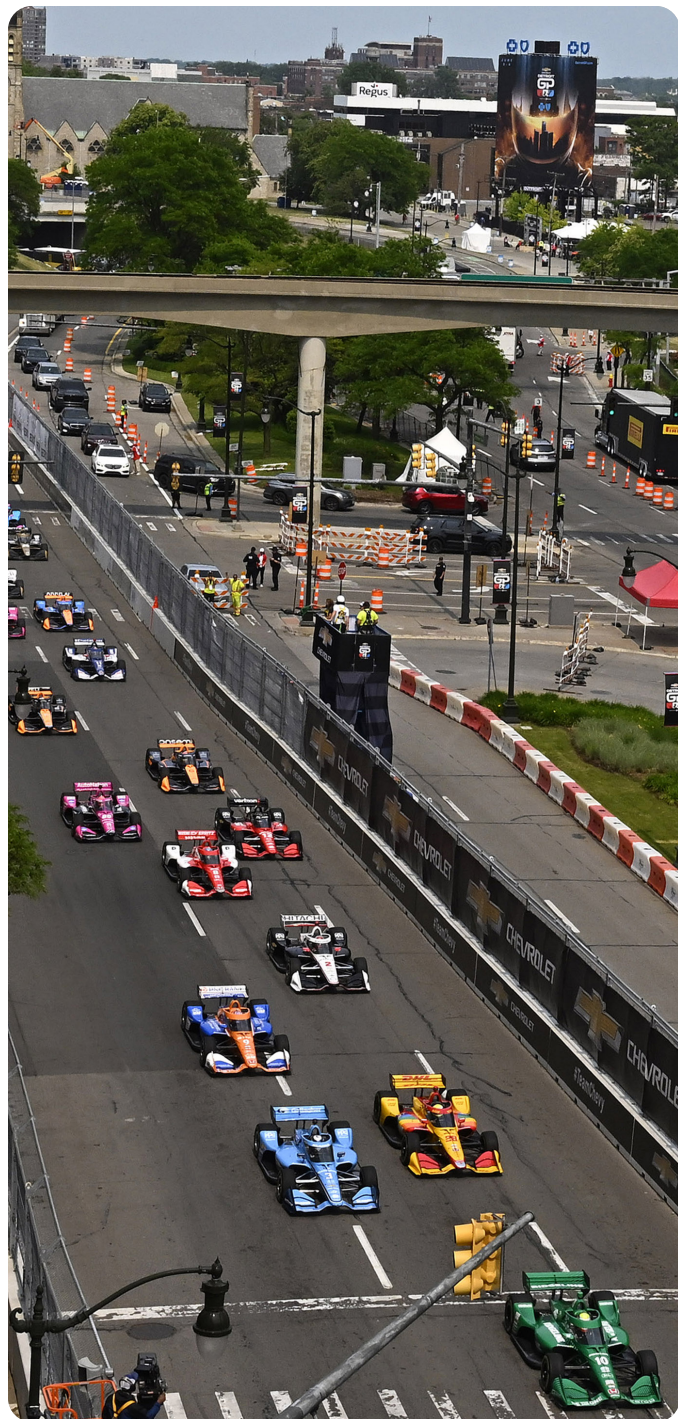
PORT ATWATER GARAGE

NEW Grandstand ticketholders and rooftop ticketholders are invited to visit the floors of the Port Atwater Garage to get a spectacular view of Turn 9 and the unique double-sided pit lane.

NOTE: Rooftop access requires a Rooftop Viewing ticket.



FRANKLIN GARAGE PARKING & TAILGATING



FRANKLIN GARAGE PARKING

Enjoy the convenience of parking within the venue. The Franklin Garage is located next to Grandstand 9 and in close proximity to Grandstand 1. A convenient option for Pit Lane Suite passholders, as well as anyone going to the paddock or Grandstand 8, simply use the bridge next to Grandstand 1.

Parking is available to ticketholders all three days and is sold in advance only. Parking space is not reserved; location is assigned upon arrival and will not provide a view of the track. Garage height is 7'3". Overnight parking is not permitted. To re-enter the parking structure via the pedestrian entrance, all guests are required to present an admission ticket or credential.

FRANKLIN GARAGE TAILGATING

The Franklin Garage located between Franklin and Woodbridge streets offers a convenient tailgating option for race fans. Tailgate parking is on levels 2-6 of the Franklin side of the garage providing views of cars racing into Turn 9, pit lane action and cars crossing the Finish Line in front of Grandstand 9. Package includes parking, 4 General Admission Rooftop tickets, and paddock access.

Garage opens at 7 am. Parking is assigned upon arrival beginning with level 6. A special traffic pattern is in effect in the Franklin Garage, drivers should be alert and proceed slowly through the garage. Franklin Garage tailgating customers are welcome to bring lawn chairs, tables, coolers, and food to enjoy their tailgating experience inside the garage. Overnight parking and open-flame grilling will NOT be permitted within the parking structure.



HOSPITALITY TICKET OPTIONS



MICHELOB ULTRA TURN 3 CLUB

Located trackside in the fan favorite exciting hairpin turn of Turn 3. This hospitality option provides guests a relaxed lounge-like atmosphere with delicious food prepared and served by local favorite, Andiamo Catering. Beer and wine are included in purchase price of pass; must be 21 years of age with a photo ID to be served.

- Club opens daily at 9 am
- Closing time is 30 minutes after conclusion of daily on-track activities



PIT LANE SUITE

Located in the paddock overlooking the unique double-sided pit lane, the suite provides a premium hospitality experience. Each suite pass provides all-inclusive access to an executive bar and dining options from the chef-created menu in a relaxed lounge setting. Friday's bar selection is limited to beer and wine, full service is available Saturday and Sunday.

Pit lane access is included; must be 18 years or older with a valid picture ID to enter pit lane. Friday's pit lane access is all day; Saturday and Sunday access begins at 9 am with varying closing times.

FREE SHUTTLE SERVICE

To help ease the challenges of moving around the venue, free golf cart shuttles, are available to all attendees and participants, throughout the event weekend. Golf carts operate continuously each day along Jefferson Avenue, between Randolph Street and Schweizer Place and along the Detroit Riverwalk, from the access ramp on the west side of Hart Plaza to east of Cullen Plaza, at Riopelle and Atwater streets. Volunteers will be stationed at each shuttle stop to provide assistance.

JEFFERSON AVENUE ROUTE

- J1 In front of Mariner’s Church at Randolph Street
- J2 At crosswalk in front of GM Renaissance Center
- J3 At corner of St. Antoine St and Jefferson Avenue
- J4 Along Jefferson Avenue, near Schweizer Place
- J5 At Beaubien and New Street (on request only)

DETROIT RIVERWALK ROUTE


- R1 At ramp leading up to west side of Hart Plaza


